Dauphine Sloan is director of the French Language Program and lecturer at the Department of French and Italian at Tulane, and an adjunct assistant professor at the Payson Center for International Development. She received her doctorate degree in Sociology from the University of Paris in 1984, with a specialization in Soviet and East European studies. She was previously Assistant Director of the Russian and Eurasian Studies Program at the Center for Strategic and International Studies, in Washington, DC. Subsequently, she managed the ACE Program (Action for Cooperation in the field of Economics) in Brussels. ACE was a European Union assistance program which funded research projects on all aspects of the transition from planned to market economies, conducted by economists in the former Soviet Union and Central and Eastern Europe.
